#### Mark Scheme for Part 9

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## Mark Criteria 5 All three parts of message clearly communicated. Only minor spelling errors or occasional grammatical errors. 4 All three parts of message communicated. Some non-impeding errors in spelling and grammar or some awkwardness of expression. 3 All three parts of message attempted. Expression requires interpretation by the reader and contains impeding errors in spelling and grammar. All three parts of the message are included but the context is incorrect. **OR** Two parts of message are clearly communicated. Only minor spelling errors or occasional grammatical errors. 2 Only two parts of message communicated. Some errors in spelling and grammar. The errors in expression may require patience and interpretation by the reader and impede communication. Only one part of the message communicated. 1 Some attempt to address the task but response is very unclear.

Candidates are penalised for not writing the minimum number of words (i.e. fewer than 25). They are not penalised for writing too much, though they are not advised to do so. Candidates also need to think carefully about who the target reader is for each task and try to write in an appropriate style. It is important to write clearly so that the answers are easy to read. However, it is not important if candidates write in upper or lower case, or if their writing is joined up or not.
